New Year Bring and Share Lunch We met for a sociable lunch on 4th January and it was very enjoyable. Many thanks to Cathrine Simmons for opening her home for us.

Leaflet in Bideford We will be leafleting in the County Council ward of Bideford North (which confusingly includes Bideford East). The aim will be to raise the profile of the Green Party. Hopefully it could lead to new members. We have chosen the ward where we have a candidate (Huw Thomas) if the County Council Elections go ahead in May. See below for more about this last point. We will meet at the Kingsley Statue at 10 am on Saturday February 15th when we will give volunteers a bunch of leaflets which should be deliverable in one to one and a half hours. If you can help it would be wonderful.

County Council Elections You may have seen that the Government published a proposal to restructure local government by abolishing the current two tier system of District and County Councils and replacing it with a Unitary authority and a Mayor. This proposal came out on 16th December and County Councils were given the option to decide to "postpone" elections due in May 25 but had three weeks to make this decision, three weeks that included the Christmas period. Devon along with a significant number of other County Councils duly voted to request postponement. This is very undemocratic as it will leave the existing County Council to make decisions which their replacement might not have agreed with.

There has also been no time to discuss what is the first major shake up of local government since 1974. On that occasion there had been a report – The |Maude report – which had looked at the issue in depth before any bill for change was drawn up. We are concerned in Torridge and North Devon that local government from Exeter would not be local at all. Also it is difficult to imagine one person representing the whole of Devon as a Mayor. It is not the same as representing a city. Even the Green Party in Exeter forgot to ask our Torridge Councillors to sign a letter to the press! Sums up the problem really.

Keep an eye on our Facebook page and in the local and national press for developments, especially whether the Government does or does not agree to postpone County Council elections.

Climate and Nature Bill This Bill comes back for its second reading on Friday 24th January. So far 108 MPs have promised to be present but Geoffrey Cox's name is not yet on the list. Please write to him at The House of Commons asking him to attend this vital Bill reading. Meanwhile Cathrine Simmons and myself are trying to arrange a face to face meeting with him beforehand.
